Excelencias,

Les bajo firmantes familiares de víctimas de violencia policial y organizaciones de la sociedad civil del mundo llamamos a los Estados parte del Consejo de Derechos Humanos de las Naciones Unidas (ONU) a convocar con urgencia una sesión especial sobre la situación de los derechos humanos en Estados Unidos, con el fin de dar una respuesta a la actual grave crisis de derechos humanos que emergió de la represión de la protesta a escala nacional. Las recientes manifestaciones irrumpieron el 26 de mayo en reacción al asesinato de George Floyd por la policía en Minneapolis, Minnesota. Este asesinato es un caso más de una larga hilera de ejecuciones extrajudiciales de personas negras por agentes de la policía y milicianos blancos armados.

Estamos profundamente preocupados por la escalada de violencia en las respuestas policiales a manifestaciones mayoritariamente pacíficas en los Estados Unidos. Esto incluye el uso de balas de goma, gas lacrimógeno, gas pimienta y en algunos casos balas de plomo, en violación de los estándares internacionales sobre el uso de la fuerza y control de multitudes y los recientes Lineamientos de las Naciones Unidas sobre armas menos letales.

Además, estamos preocupados porque, en lugar de usar su posición para incitar a la calma y a la unidad, el presidente Trump elige crear tensiones a través de su retórica. Esto queda evidenciado en su promesa de hacerse de la autoridad de los gobernadores que se niegan a adoptar las tácticas más extremas contra los manifestantes y sus amenazas de desplegar las fuerzas armadas federales contra los manifestantes (lo que sería de una legalidad cuestionable).

Nuestra preocupación más grave es que la violencia y contraviolencia está distraiendo la mirada de la comunidad global del dolor expresado por una nación enlutada por la crueldad de los nueve minutos que terminaron con la vida de George Floyd, bajo la mirada de un grupo de policías; por la muerte por coronavirus de más de 100 000 personas, con una representación desproporcionada de víctimas negras y marrones; y por la injusticia que no da tregua y la igualdad que nunca termina de llegar. Nuestra preocupación es que los gases lacrimógenos y los disturbios fomentados por la policía opaquen la legítima pasión de estas manifestaciones que es seria. Las voces de los manifestantes deben ser escuchadas. Exigen que el racismo, el odio, el miedo y la disparidad finalmente sean confrontados.

Informes mediáticos hacen caso de siete personas baleadas en una protesta en Louisville. Por lo menos una persona, David McAtee, quien servía comida a los manifestantes en una protesta, fue matado por balas policiales en Kentucky. En Ohio, se usó gas pimienta indiscriminadamente sobre multitudes. Informes periodísticos en redes sociales indican que balas de goma fueron disparadas en varios lugares, como Phoenix en Arizona, Los Angeles en California, Atlanta en Georgia y Minneapolis en Minnesota. Según la Alta Comisionada de las Naciones Unidas para los Derechos Humanos, "hubo por lo menos 200 denuncias de

periodistas que cubrían las protestas que fueron físicamente atacados, intimididades o detenidos de manera arbitraria, a pesar de tener su credencial de prensa claramente a la vista". Las fuerzas policiales detuvieron más de 10 000 personas en los Estados Unidos.

Además, pareciera que departamentos de policía a lo largo y ancho de Estados Unidos, apoyadas por agencias federales (como la Oficina de Aduanas y Protección Fronteriza de Estados Unidos, que viola regularmente los derechos civiles y humanos) están agravando la situación con más militarización y uso excesivo de fuerza contra manifestantes.

Observamos con inquietud el despliegue de al menos 62 000 soldados de la Guardia Nacional en dos docenas de estados, el llamado al uso de violencia y detenciones masivas por el presidente Trump en redes sociales y su referencia a manifestantes como "terroristas". Varias ciudades del país impusieron un toque de queda que inflamó la situación aún más y creó una justificación adicional para más violencia policial y más detenciones.

Está claramente establecido que ni el uso de violencia por una pequeña cantidad de personas ni los daños a la propiedad pueden ser motivo para suspender el derecho a la protesta de todos. Tampoco autorizan a la policía a aumentar su respuesta y hacer uso de fuerza excesiva o letal. En toda circunstancia, la respuesta policial debe atenerse a los límites de la ley y buscar desactivar las situaciones violentas y no exacerbarlas con armas mortales.

El derecho de asamblea pacífica y manifestación debe ser protegido. Este mandato es aún más urgente en relación a los derechos de las minorías, sobre todo afrodescendientes, a denunciar prácticas racistas que soportan desde hace siglos. Los recientes asesinatos de personas negras no armadas y la represión de las manifestaciones violan las obligaciones de los Estados Unidos de acuerdo al Pacto Internacional de Derechos Civiles y Políticos (PIDCyP), la Convención contra la Tortura y Otros Tratos o Penas Crueles, Inhumanos o Degradantes (CCT) y la Convención Internacional sobre la Eliminación de todas las formas de Discriminación Racial (CERD).

Finalmente, el uso masivo de armas menos letales está complejizado por el hecho que Estados Unidos es uno de los países más afectados por la pandemia. Expertos avisaron que el uso de gas lacrimógeno puede poner en situación de mayor riesgo de contraer una enfermedad respiratoria y puede tener efectos a largo plazo sobre la capacidad respiratoria. También estamos preocupados por las detenciones de manifestantes y detenciones masivas que solo incrementan el riesgo de infección en las cárceles que ya son un epicentro del COVID-19 en los Estados Unidos.

A la luz de estas graves preocupaciones, les abajo firmantes instamos a los miembros del Consejo de Derechos Humanos de la ONU a encomendar una investigación independiente sobre:

- el historial reciente de prácticas racistas de la policía en todo el país y que continúa con aparente impunidad, desde el asesinato de Michael Brown y la represión de las manifestaciones en Ferguson, Misuri, al asesinato de George Floyd.
- denuncias de uso excesivo de la fuerza contra manifestantes y periodistas en las manifestaciones en ciudades estadounidenses desde el asesinato de George Floyd.

La investigación debería reportar sus conclusiones al Alto Comisionado de Derechos Humanos y debería incluir recomendaciones sobre cómo asegurar que los Estados Unidos respeten sus obligaciones relativas a los derechos humanos, inclusive en contexto de intervención policial, de protesta y de asamblea. Además, el informe debería destacar la responsabilidad de los Estados Unidos de terminar con la impunidad de la violencia policial y otras graves violaciones a través de acciones disciplinarias adecuadas, acusaciones y juicios justos.

El Consejo debería llamar a los Estados Unidos a otorgar el acceso pleno e irrestricto para entrevistar a testigos (entre ellos miembros de la policía), para inspeccionar los lugares de detención y para monitorear los juicios relacionados con las manifestaciones y sus etapas posteriores a quienes investigan y a otros oficiales de la ONU (incluyendo mandatarios de procedimientos especiales)
